

Tennessee Foreclosure Trends: Q4 2011

How many/where/patterns

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According to the latest data from the RealtyTrac® *US Foreclosure Market Report*, the number of properties with foreclosure filings in Tennessee decreased from 7,711 in Q3 2011 to 7,088 in Q4 2011, an eight percent decline compared to the previous quarter and the same quarter last year (Q4 2010). Tennessee had one foreclosure filing for every 392 housing units. Nation-wide, the total number of properties with foreclosure filings declined by four percent from the third quarter of 2011, and declined by 27 percent from the fourth quarter of 2010.

The total foreclosure filings in the four counties with the highest number of foreclosure filings (Davidson, Hamilton, Knox, and Shelby) accounted for 44 percent of the total foreclosure filings in the state in Q4 2011. Loudon County, with one filing for every 140 housing units, had the highest foreclosure rate in the state. The total number of properties with foreclosure filings in Loudon County increased to 145, a 179 percent increase from the previous quarter.

The county with the highest number of properties with foreclosure filings in the state was Shelby, with 1,587 properties. In Shelby County, the total volume of foreclosure filings increased by 16 percent from the previous quarter and declined by 29 percent from the same quarter last year (Q4 2010). Davidson County followed Shelby with 794 properties with foreclosure filings. In Davidson County, the total number of properties with foreclosure filings decreased by 17 percent from last quarter (Q3 2011) and decreased by four percent from the same quarter last year (Q4 2010). The county with the third highest number of properties with foreclosure filings was Knox (410), followed by Hamilton County (356). Both Knox and Hamilton counties had a substantial decline in foreclosure filings compared to the previous quarter, 36 percent and 21 percent, respectively.

Fifty-nine counties recorded declines in foreclosure filings from last quarter, while 32 counties had increases. Four counties did not see any change in the number of properties with foreclosure filings. Compared to the same quarter last year, the number of properties with foreclosure filings declined in 37 counties, while 54 counties had increases. Four counties did not have any change from the previous year.
