We are proud to present the Program Summary for calendar year 2015. THDA is the state's housing finance agency. Our purpose is to meaningfully expand safe, sound, affordable housing opportunities for low and moderate income Tennesseans. Once again, as we have since being established by the General Assembly, we have worked with our partners to provide many thousands of safe, sound, affordable housing opportunities to Tennessee households.

Since 1973, THDA has worked closely with lenders, real estate professionals, builders, nonprofit and for-profit developers and planners to help communities serve the housing needs of their constituents. We finance mortgage loans for homebuyers, most looking for their first home, with moderate, middle income. We have about two billion dollars of those loans on our books and the earnings from that portfolio not only cover the full cost of everything we do, but it generates additional earnings that we creatively reinvest to help communities address other affordable housing challenges. That's where we get the dollars for the Housing Trust Fund, our homebuyer education program, and other initiatives that we've designed. We also administer nine federal programs for households in the State of Tennessee.

In this document you will find a production report for each county, Congressional district and the state. You will be pleased to know THDA is directly responsible for \$457 million in economic activity, with a total estimated economic impact of \$802 million for the year. The work stimulates job growth – the impact calculator reveals THDA-related activities created more than 5,027 jobs. The information in this book is also available through our new interactive online map. I invite you to review this exciting new tool by visiting, though-quantum-red.

THDA's mission is key to Tennessee's continued strong growth. We are committed to serving those who need housing assistance, and providing affordable mortgage loans for those ready for the responsibility and security of homeownership.

Economic Impact

"Leading Tennessee Home by creating safe, sound, affordable housing opportunities" is the mission of THDA. A safe, sound, affordable home supports family and individual health, economic and employment success, educational achievement, and contributes to the sustainability of the neighborhood and the community. In addition to benefitting individuals and families, THDA programs create additional jobs, income, and spending in the local economy and add to state and local revenues.

Economic Impact of THDA-Related Activities in 2015

Total economic impact described below is the sum of direct THDA spending, indirect business to business transactions in Tennessee's economy and additional employee spending.

Business revenue

- The total contribution of THDA-related activities to Tennessee's economy was estimated at \$802 million in 2015.
 - Of this total, \$457 million was directly injected into the economy by THDA-related activities.
 - Every \$100 of THDA-related activities generated an additional \$75 in the business revenues.

Personal income

- THDA-related activities generated \$237 million in wages and salaries in 2015.
 - Every \$100 of personal income produced an additional \$84 of wages and salaries in the local economy.

Employment / Job Creation

- THDA-related activities created 5,027 jobs in 2015.
 - Every 100 jobs created by THDA-related activities, primarily in the construction sector, generated 94 additional jobs throughout the local economy.

State and local taxes

• THDA-related activities accounted for \$28 million in state and local taxes in 2015.

In this study, we developed a comprehensive framework to estimate the economic impact of the THDA activities in providing safe, sound, affordable housing options to households of low- and moderate-income. To this end, we reviewed THDA programs, both loans and grants, to determine the scope and the monetary flows of each program's activities. Because of the economic multipliers, or the "ripple" effect, our affordable housing programs impact all industries in the economy, going far beyond the specific unit or the neighborhood in which THDA program money is spent¹.

THDA Program Descriptions

Community Investment Tax Credit (CITC)

Financial institutions may obtain a credit against the franchise - excise tax liability when qualified loans, investments, grants, or contributions are extended to eligible non-profit organizations, development districts, public housing authorities, or THDA for activities that create or preserve affordable housing, help low-income Tennesseans obtain affordable housing, or build the capacity of eligible non-profit organizations that improve housing opportunities for low income Tennesseans. Households served are those who are at or below 80% of the area median income as determined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the Housing Choice Voucher Program.

Emergency Solutions Grant Program (ESG)

THDA administers the federally-funded Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program on behalf of the State of Tennessee to improve the housing stability of individuals and families who are homeless or threatened with homelessness. Funds may be used to help meet the costs of operating and maintaining emergency shelters, to provide essential services, to undertake street outreach, and to provide emergency intervention assistance to prevent homelessness, and rapid re-housing services to move families quickly to permanent housing. ESG funds are awarded competitively to nonprofit organizations and local governments across the state of Tennessee and non-competitively to Small City Entitlement Communities under the Community Development Block Grant program.

Foreclosure Prevention Program

As part of the 2013 National Mortgage Settlement with the nation's largest servicers, Tennessee's Attorney General allocated funding for THDA's Foreclosure Prevention Program. Since then, THDA has awarded over 1.9 million of these funds to nonprofit agency offices across the state to provide free and confidential counseling services for Tennesseans facing financial difficulties that may lead them to default and foreclosure. THDA has partnered with NeighborWorks® America to provide certification training. THDA's certified foreclosure prevention counselors possess a strong knowledge in the area of mortgage default and/or foreclosure intervention counseling, specifically relating to current industry practices of loss mitigation to include loan repayment, forbearance, modification, refinance, loan assumption, short sale, deed-in-lieu, community referrals and other remedies available to the homeowner to avoid foreclosure. THDA's Foreclosure Prevention Program was previously funded through the National Foreclosure Mitigation Counseling grant program. THDA maintains a list of certified counselors on our website, www.thda.org.

HOME Program

THDA administers the federally-funded HOME Program on behalf of the State of Tennessee to promote the production, preservation and rehabilitation of housing for individuals and families of low income. THDA'S HOME funds are awarded annually through a competitive application process to cities, counties, and nonprofit organizations serving communities that do not receive their own allocation of HOME funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Additionally, Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDOs) serving any community in Tennessee may also receive funding through the State's HOME program.

Homebuyer Education Program

Since the home purchase process can be costly and complex, THDA requires homebuyer education for all Great Choice Plus mortgage program applicants and encourages it for everyone considering homeownership. The purpose of homebuyer education is not only to assist people with purchasing homes, but also to help them become successful homeowners. THDA provides approved local nonprofit organizations and UT Extension agents with materials to teach first-time homebuyer education classes and hosts certification training for homebuyer education providers. THDA also maintains a calendar of approved classes on its website and a county-specific list of certified homebuyer educators who can help consumers as they consider purchasing a home.

Homeownership Loan Program

Since its inception in 1973, THDA has helped more than 112,000 households become homeowners through its Single Family Homeownership Loan Programs. THDA offers affordable, 30-year fixed rate mortgages for income eligible, first-time buyers through local lenders: Great Choice, Great Choice Plus, and the Homeownership for the Brave. Great Choice offers a competitive interest rate on a 30-year fixed rate mortgage. If a borrower needs downpayment and/or closing costs assistance they can receive the Great Choice Plus second mortgage to accompany the Great Choice first mortgage. Great Choice Plus offers up to four percent of the sales price at a zero percent interest rate, deferred payment, 15 year loan. Homeownership for the Brave offers a .5 percent discount to the Great Choice interest rate for those eligible veterans, active duty military and national guardsmen. New Start loans, delivered only through nonprofit housing providers for households of very low income, are designed to promote the construction of new houses and carry a zero percent interest rate.

Keep My Tennessee Home

The Keep My Tennessee Home Program (Tennessee's Hardest Hit Fund) provided forgivable loans to unemployed or substantially underemployed homeowners who, through no fault of their own, were financially unable to make their mortgage payments and were in danger of losing their homes to foreclosure or to homeowners who had experienced a divorce or death of a spouse. Tennessee was one of 18 states plus the District of Columbia that received Hardest Hit Funds due to having an unemployment rate that was higher than the national average. THDA committed all funds allocated to mortgage assistance in 2014. THDA continues to make mortgage payments for eligible borrowers through the program.

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

THDA administers the federally funded Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) that assists households below 150% of the federal poverty standards to meet their home energy needs and improve the energy efficiency of their homes. LIHEAP provides regular and crisis assistance across Tennessee in partnership with local community service agencies and local governments. Priority in energy assistance, as well as the level of assistance, is based on the energy burden, income, household size, and the presence of in the household of, the elderly, individuals with disabilities, and young children. LIHEAP funds are also provided to meet the health and safety needs of homes receiving assistance under the State's Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP).

THDA Program Descriptions

Low-Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC)

The Low-Income Housing Tax Credit is a credit against federal income tax liability for owners of and investors in affordable rental housing. The tax credit was designed to create and preserve safe and affordable rental housing for households of low income. The amount of tax credit is based on reasonable costs of development, as determined by THDA, and the number of qualified affordable units.

Medical Hardship Program

In 2013, Tennessee participated in a state-federal mortgage servicing settlement with the nation's largest servicers. Thirty-five million dollars from the National Mortgage Settlement was allocated by Tennessee's Attorney General to THDA's Keep My Tennessee Home Program. From these funds, \$25 million dollars was used to create the AG Medical Hardship Program. This program provides mortgage and mortgage related assistance to persons fighting foreclosure as a result of a long-term medical hardship.

Multifamily Tax-Exempt Bond Authority

The Multifamily Tax-Exempt Bond Authority program provides financing for new construction of affordable rental housing units, for conversion of existing properties through adaptive reuse, or for acquisition and rehabilitation of rental units. Municipalities receive an allocation of the state's tax-exempt bond authority and sell bonds in support of housing development.

Section 8 Project-Based Rental Assistance (Contract Administration)

The Section 8 Contract Administration Division manages the Housing Assistance Payment contracts between HUD and Section 8 property owners across the State. To complete this work, THDA processes monthly payments to owners, oversees annual contract renewals/adjustments with property agents, and handles resident issue calls from tenants. In return, Section 8 property owner-agents provide safe, decent and affordable housing units at 393 properties to an estimated 30,000 elderly, disabled or low-income Tennessee households. Unlike the "Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher" program these Performance-Based HUD subsidies do not follow tenants directly, but rather are tied to units at specific properties under long-term contracts with HUD.

Section 8 Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (Housing Choice Vouchers)

The Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program provides monthly rental assistance to eligible participants who are elderly, disabled, or of very low income. This HUD-funded program enables eligible households or individuals to obtain decent, safe, and sanitary housing by paying a portion of rental costs. Participants are able to find their own housing in the private market, including single-family homes, townhouses, and apartments. The housing subsidy is paid to the landlord directly by THDA on behalf of the participating household. The household then pays the difference when applicable between the actual rent charged by the landlord and the amount subsidized by the program. THDA administers the HCV program in 72 Tennessee counties. The program is administered in the remaining counties by other public housing agencies (PHAs). Section 8 Tenant-Based Rental Assistance Continued

With the Family Self Sufficiency (FSS) program, THDA works with households and interested parties to create step-by-step plans that lead to economic independence in a five-year time period. The purpose of the FSS program is to facilitate access to supportive services that households could use to become free of public assistance. All participating Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) households have the option to participate.

THDA's Homeownership Voucher Program offers a mortgage subsidy to low income households that currently receive Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Rental Assistance. The subsidy factors are the same as the rental program. There is a consideration for additional expenses related to homeownership. THDA's assistance allows households of low income to purchase a home they would otherwise not be able to. The mortgage assistance payment is paid directly to the lender or loan servicing company. The households must complete both pre-purchase and post-purchase counseling.

Tennessee Housing Trust Fund (THTF)

The Tennessee Housing Trust Fund (THTF) was expands housing options for very low income Tennesseans by leveraging THDA funds with private sector investment and matching funds from local grantees. The THTF resources are used to assist the following programs:

- The Competitive Grants Program provides grants for the rehabilitation or construction of affordable rental housing for very low income families and individuals. Applications are accepted through two funding rounds annually.
- The Emergency Repair Program provides grants of up to \$10,000 to elderly homeowners and homeowners which include a family member with a disability to repair or replace essential systems and/or critical structural problems.
- The Housing Modification and Repair Program is administered by the United Cerebral Palsy of Middle Tennessee in partnership with nonprofit organizations across Tennessee to build ramps and improve the accessibility of homes for low income individuals with disabilities.
- The Rebuild and Recover Program provides resources to local communities impacted by a weather-related incident that does not rise to the level of a presidential or state declared disaster.

Additionally, the THTF provides funding to Habitat for Humanity of Tennessee to support the construction of single family homes across the state.

Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP)

Tennessee's Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) assists households with an income at or below 200 percent of the federal poverty standards to reduce their fuel costs while contributing to national energy conservation through increased energy efficiency and consumer education. Examples of common weatherization measures that may be provided are weather stripping, air sealing, caulking, replacement of inefficient HVAC units, and adding of insulation to attics, walls, and floors. The program is administered with LIHEAP Weatherization resources to eliminate health and safety issues of assisted units.

Tennessee Program Totals

Homeownership and Maintenance

The Great Choice and New Start Homeownership Loan Programs created 2,275 homeowners, with first loans totaling \$278.8 million. In addition, 2,174 second loans in the amount of \$10.9 million were funded in the same period. The Homebuyer Education Program provided area agencies \$536,500 to counsel 2,196 families in their home purchase.

The Medical Hardship Program provided \$967,717 in the form of forgivable loans to 33 eligible Tennessee homeowners with a long-term medical disability. The Foreclosure Prevention Program provided \$563,850 to non-profits to assist 1,082 homeowners in preventing and mitigating the impact of foreclosure. Grants totaling \$467,000 were provided to Legal Assistance agencies to provide legal services related to foreclosure prevention activities.

The **HOME Program** awarded \$10.7 million to local governments and non-profit organizations to provide rehabilitation and homeownership services to 288 households.

Tennessee's Housing Trust Fund supports several affordable housing programs.

- The Habitat for Tennessee Program provided \$491,694 to local Habitat affiliates to help 29 low-income home buyers.
- The Housing Modification and Ramps Program provided \$103,074 to make 79 homes accessible for persons with disabilities.
- In partnership with U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), the THDA/USDA Rural Housing Repair Program
 provided \$421,494 to assist 82 elderly and disabled households. The THDA/USDA Rural Repair Program was ended
 in July 2015, and the annual allocation of \$700,000 will become part of the Emergency Repair for the Elderly
 Program.
- The Emergency Repair Program provided \$2 million in home repair assistance for 284 eligible elderly or disabled households.

Lenders received Community Investment Tax Credits on \$6.5 million in below market loans or contributions made to eligible non-profit agencies to assist 325 households through a range of housing services and to create or preserve 325 units of affordable housing.

With \$441,832, the **Weatherization Assistance Program** helped an estimated 111 low-income homeowners reduce their energy bills by making their homes more energy efficient.

The **Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program** awarded \$22.5 million to non-profits serving Tennessee to assist 34,841 low-income homeowners with their heating and cooling expenses.

Rental Development and Assistance Programs

The Housing Trust Fund's Competitive Grants Program awarded \$3.8 million to 16 non-profit organizations to develop affordable rental housing across Tennessee, serving 280 households.

Low Income Housing Tax Credits in the amount of \$222.7 million were allocated to create or rehabilitate 4,860 affordable rental units.

Developers used \$118.4 million in Multi-Family Bond Authority to create or rehabilitate 2,366 rental apartments.

Lenders received Community Investment Tax Credits on \$78.3 million in below market loans or contributions made to eligible non-profit agencies to assist 1,746 households through a range of housing services and to create or preserve 1,647 units of affordable rental housing.

Section 8 Rental Assistance helped 40,604 households paying \$194.4 million in rent and utility assistance. Of this:

- **Tenant-based Housing Choice Voucher** assistance of \$32.5 million aided 6,744 households living in privately owned rental housing. Through the Section 8 to Homeownership Program, 44 families receiving housing choice vouchers utilized \$175,333 in vouchers to make mortgage payments rather than rental payments.
 - The Family Self Sufficiency Program assistance helped 245 Housing Choice Voucher Program participants work toward self-sufficiency through education, training, and case management. The escrow component of the program helped the participants save a total of \$294,267 in escrow/savings. 22 participants graduated from the program and received a total of \$92,237 in escrow disbursements.
- **Project-based** assistance of \$161.7 million helped 33,816 families pay an affordable rent in properties under contract with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

With \$71,824, the **Weatherization Assistance Program** helped an estimated 15 low-income renters reduce their energy bills by making their homes more energy efficient.

The **Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program** awarded \$32.9 million to non-profits serving Tennessee to assist 62,982 low-income renters with paying heating and cooling expenses.

Homelessness Assistance and Prevention

The Emergency Solutions Grant Program awarded \$4.1 million to non-profits serving Tennessee to support area emergency shelters, transitional housing facilities, rapid re-housing assistance, street outreach services, and Homeless Management Information Systems (HMIS).





Figure 2. Percentage of Households/Units and Dollars Expended/Allocated by THDA Rental Program, 2015



Figure 3. Percentage of Households/Units and Dollars Expended/Allocated by THDA Homeownership Programs, 2015





Figure 4. Percentage of THDA Totals by Homeownership and Rental Programs, 2015











Statewide, 2,365 units funded with LIHTC also received Multi-Family Bond Authority funding. To prevent double counting, those units are removed from the total. Homebuyer Education households/units are not included because they are counted as part of the Homeownership Loan Program.

Methodology



Methodology

Community Investment Tax Credit (CITC)

Community Investment Tax Credit (CITC) dollars represent the amount of below market loans or qualified investments or grants that are extended to organizations in order to receive tax credit, rather than the amount of the tax credit itself. CITC funds can be used for homeownership, rental, and homelessness prevention activities. The number of households served and their corresponding dollar amounts are given separately for each of these activities. Funds also may be used for security deposits, rent, and utilities. Cumulative dollar amounts and households served are not separated by activity because the relevant data were not collected from the beginning of the program.

In previous years, the number of units that were rehabilitated or reconstructed with the CITC funds were reported rather than the number of households that were served. Differences between units and households exist when services are tied to housing services and assistance such as counseling, supports or downpayment assistance. In 2015, we switched to reporting the households served, but we do not have comparable data for the previous years. Therefore, the cumulative number of households served with CITC funds underestimates the actual number of households that were helped with the program.

Downpayment Loans

In October 2013, the Great Choice Program replaced the Great Rate, Great Advantage and Great Start Programs, and borrowers who needed downpayment and closing costs assistance were allowed to use second mortgage loans up to four percent of the sale price. Downpayment loan units and dollars represent the number and dollar amount of second mortgage loans funded for the Great Choice Program borrowers who needed downpayment and closing costs assistance.

Emergency Solutions Grant Program (ESG)

In 2012, the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) replaced what was formerly the Emergency Shelter Grant Program. ESG awards funds to nonprofits that serve multiple counties. There is not a straightforward way to determine a breakdown of dollars by county since providers serve all individuals in their home county, but pull from a wider group of counties for their service area.

In previous years, ESG dollar amounts awarded to a non-profit agency were reported in each county the agency served, assuming that every county within the service area of the non-profit agency had equal access to the ESG funds awarded to the non-profit agency. While technically accurate in terms of funds county residents could benefit from, the county of the non-profit agency was the greater beneficiary since most services were provided at the agency's site. For the 2015 report, we switched to reporting the dollars only in the county where the non-profit agency is geographically located. While the service area may be larger than the county in which the agency is located, this will more accurately describe the pattern of ESG grantees.

Foreclosure Prevention Program

Foreclosure Prevention counseling is provided by non-profits across the state. The county-level data are based on the address of the household served, rather than the address of the non-profit service provider. Because agencies may counsel the same person multiple times, beneficiaries are counted just once in the cumulative total, even if they received counseling in different years.

HOME Program

HOME funds are awarded annually through a competitive application process to cities, counties, and nonprofit organizations, including Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDOs) outside the local participating jurisdictions that receive their own HOME allocation directly from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Due to pending federal regulatory changes, HOME funds were not awarded to local grantees in 2012 and 2013. These changes delayed the awarding of HOME funds, therefore 2013 CHDO dollars were awarded during the period covered by this report. During the 2015 calendar year, 2014 urban/rural and CHDO funds were also awarded.

As of calendar year 2015, rental housing activities are no longer eligible for funding through the state HOME Program. All of the HOME activities during this reporting period were homeownership activities. From 2004 to 2009, the HOME program also funded American Dream Downpayment Initiative (ADDI). The cumulative HOME dollars and units include ADDI.

Homebuyer Education Program

The Homebuyer Education Program pays the costs for certified counseling agencies to provide homebuyer education for those whose mortgages are funded by THDA's homeownership loan programs. For the purposes of this summary report, payments are reflected in the counties where THDA customers purchased homes, rather than in the counties where the homebuyer education providers are located. A difference in time may occur between the date someone receives homebuyer education and the date of funding the loan due to the length of the home buying process. Additionally, some THDA loan products do not require homebuyer education. Therefore, the number of loans funded in a county may differ from the number of borrowers who received homebuyer education in the county.

Although the Homebuyer Education Program began in 2003, the cumulative totals include only 2007 through 2015 data.

Homeownership Loan Programs

The 2015 Homeownership Loan Program includes mortgage loans funded during the year through the Great Choice, Great Choice Plus and New Start loan programs.

The number and dollar amount of second mortgage loans for the Great Choice Program borrowers who needed downpayment and closing costs assistance are not included in the Homeownership Loan Program units and dollars. The second mortgage loans are reported separately under the Downpayment Loan Program.

Methodology

Keep My Tennessee Home

Keep My Tennessee Home (Tennessee's Hardest Hit Fund) provides forgivable loans to unemployed, substantially underemployed, recently divorced, and surviving spouse homeowners to make their mortgage payments.

THDA approved the last borrower for the Keep My Tennessee Home Program in November 2014, but continued disbursing funds on behalf of the borrowers approved previously. Disbursed dollar amounts show the payments that were made during the calendar year.

Legal Assistance Program

At the request of the Attorney General (AG), Tennessee Housing Development Agency (THDA) used a portion of the Attorney General Settlement Funds to fund a Legal Assistance Program for legal services and/or foreclosure prevention activities.

The dollar amount represent the amount disbursed in 2015 to the Legal Assistance Program Providers (LAPP) that were selected by the AG to participate in this program.

Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) assists low income households with affording home energy costs. LIHEAP is administered through a network of local agencies that serve all 95 counties. The total dollar amounts reflect the invoiced amounts (including both program and administrative spending) from LIHEAP providers for 2015. The number of households served and the dollar amount of LIHEAP assistance provided in each county include both Crisis LIHEAP and Regular LIHEAP number of household served and payments combined during the calendar year.

Although LIHEAP was first funded in 1981, the cumulative totals reflected in this report start in 2014, which is when THDA began administering the program in October 2013.

Low-Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC)

Federal low-income housing tax credits are awarded through the LIHTC program to developers of qualified projects. Competitive (nine percent) and non-competitive (four percent) credits are included in the reporting. The units that are counted in a given year are based on the year in which the tax credits are allocated, rather than the year in which the property construction or rehabilitation is completed. The dollars listed under the LIHTC program represent the total value of tax credits over 10 years.

Medical Hardship Program (Attorneys General National Mortgage Servicer Settlement, Keep My Tennessee Home Long-Term Medical Disability Hardship Program)

The Medical Hardship Program provides forgivable loans to eligible Tennessee homeowners with a long-term medical disability hardship.

Two types of data are shown: allocated and disbursed. The allocated units reflect the number of borrowers whose assistance was approved during the year. Allocated dollars reflect the amount of assistance that will be paid. Disbursed dollar amounts show the payments that were made during the calendar year.

Because allocations are made in a single year and disbursements occur across multiple years, it is possible that some counties will show dollar amounts without units and vice versa.

Multi-Family Tax-Exempt Bond Authority

THDA issues bond authority to local issuers for multi-family development. Multi-Family Bond Authority developments almost always receive non-competitive (4 percent) tax credits. Therefore, the units reported under this program are also counted in the LIHTC programs. In 2015, 2,365 units funded with LIHTC also received \$118.4 million in Multi-Family Bond Authority funding.

Section 8 Project-Based Rental Assistance (Contract Administration)

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) contracts with THDA to administer 393 Section 8 project-based contracts. This figure includes one Section 8 project-based property that is part of the THDA portfolio. The figures reported at the county level reflect the total number of families served in 2015. Because some families may have moved to project-based units in other counties during the year, county totals are not added to determine the state total. Instead, a separate state total is calculated by counting each family once. Because of the structure of the program, it is difficult to compute a meaningful cumulative total.

Section 8 Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (Housing Choice Vouchers)

Section 8 Rental Assistance units and amounts reflect the number of families who used a voucher to lease a privately owned unit or pay a mortgage through THDA's Housing Choice Voucher Program in 2015. The figures reported at the county-level reflect the total number of families served in 2015. The numbers do not reflect vouchers administered by other public housing agencies who operate a voucher program in counties THDA does not serve or in counties where THDA overlaps service with another agency. Because some families may have moved and used vouchers in multiple counties during the year, county totals are not added to determine the state total. Instead, a separate state total is calculated by counting each family once. Because the structure of the program, it is difficult to compute a meaningful cumulative total.

Methodology

Tennessee Housing Trust Fund

In 2015, the Tennessee Housing Trust Fund (THTF) funded five programs: The Competitive Grants Program, Habitat Tennessee Set-Aside, Housing Modifications and Ramps Program, Rural Housing Repair Program, and Emergency Repair Program. The Manufactured Home Program was discontinued and has no funding associated with it in 2015. The cumulative units and dollar amount of the THTF include Manufactured Home Program. There were no new Rebuild and Recover Program funds awarded in 2015.

The dollar amounts for THTF programs include the administrative funds provided to grantees. The dollar amounts and households served for all of the THTF programs, with the exception of the Competitive Grants Program and the Rebuild and Recover Program, are based on expenditures that occurred during the year.

For the Competitive Grants Program and Rebuild and Recover Program, cumulative units are based on the proposed number of households served. Cumulative dollar amounts reflect awards made during the calendar year.

Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP)

In July 2012, the Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) was transferred from the Department of Human Services (DHS) to THDA. Although WAP was first funded in 1976, the cumulative totals reflected in this report start in 2013.

The total dollar amounts reflect the invoiced amounts (including both program and administrative spending) from weatherization providers for 2015.

CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT NOTES

Congressional district boundaries for 2015 are based on the 113th session of the U.S. Congress. Calculations include an entire county's data for all counties represented in the district, not just the portion of the county in the district. Some counties may be included in more than one congressional district, which means the state total cannot be determined by summing the district totals. The cumulative totals for the congressional districts represent the current configuration of the district. Therefore, they may differ from totals in previous years.

With the exceptions of the Section 8 programs, the figures for the congressional district rely on the methodologies outlined for the individual programs. For both Section 8 programs, if a beneficiary received assistance in more than one county within the district, the beneficiary is counted only once within a given district.



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
